- » Home to 11 K2Mrs!

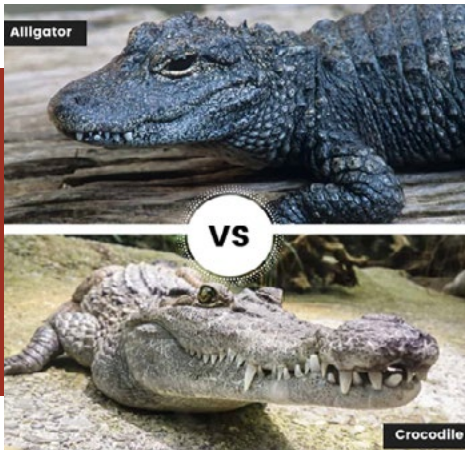


FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT IN CENTRAL FLORIDA

On a trip to Kissimmee to watch my nephew play college baseball I stumbled upon what looked to me like a Frank Lloyd Wright building. Indeed it was! And not just one. Florida Southern College in Lakeland, FL has the largest single-site collection of structures designed by Frank Lloyd Wright – 13 to be exact.

Wright is referred to as the father of American Architecture. His organic philosophy of connecting the built environment with nature grew into a movement know as Prairie School architecture. His iconic architecture can be identified by its low roof lines, strong horizontal elements, geometric shapes, with materials and colors found in nature. The sun with its shadows cast throughout a day are playful surprises found in Wright's buildings.

Designed and built during the Great Depression, the College President hired students to construct the buildings in exchange for an education. The restored Annie Pfeiffer Chapel is a living example of Wright's philosophy. The "compressed" entrance with its low ceilings and narrow walkway is "released" into the sanctuary where colorful reflections from the stained glass windows dance around the walls. Alligators have a wide, U-shaped snout, while crocodiles have a pointed, V-shaped snout and show their 4th tooth.
