### **Resolving Asthma Medication Access** Barriers

*Clinical Pharmacist, Population Health at Partners For Kids* The 2020 focused NHLBI asthma guideline updates recommend treatment approaches that deviated significantly from traditional step-therapy pathways. This session will review updated asthma guidelines and practical approaches for pharmacists to resolve common barriers to implementation. At the end of the presentation pharmacists will have a deeper understanding of updated approaches to asthma treatment and will be equipped with resources to support provider and patient access to evidence-based asthma therapies.

### **Beyond Blood Sugar: Impact of the Social Determinants of Health on Patients with Diabetes**

Almost 12 percent of the U.S. population is living with diabetes. While there is a genetic component to the condition, nonmedical factors, called the social determinants of health (SDOH), also impact patients' disease progression, management, and outcomes. In this session, participants will consider how factors like socioeconomic status, education, and healthcare access can influence patients living with diabetes. An interactive patient case will be woven throughout the presentation to illustrate the impact of SDOH on diabetes outcomes. Participants will be armed with practical tools and knowledge they can apply to different situations to mitigate SDOH concerns and improve patient outcomes.

At the completion of this activity, the participant will be able to:

- 1. describe social determinants and how they affect diabetes prevalence, management, and outcomes; and

### **Connected Care: Pharmacist Utilization of Remote Monitoring to Support Clinical Services**

Encompassing remote physiologic monitoring (RPM) and remote therapeutic monitoring (RTM), remote monitoring is a growing area of focus in healthcare with increasing interest from patients, healthcare providers, and health systems; expanding coverage by payers; and improved access to compatible devices and service providers. This model of care allows pharmacists to leverage technology to improve patient care, promote efficiency, and receive reimbursement for disease state management services provided. This session will include a description of a successful remote physiologic monitoring service paired with a pharmacist collaborative practice agreement for hypertension management through two phases of implementation in a network of primary care clinics.

At the completion of this activity, the participant will be able to:

- identify the differences between remote physiologic monitoring and remote therapeutic moni-toring services; and
- 2. discuss the principles of billing for remote physiologic monitoring services.
